[EU Business School](#) conducted research and gathered data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, LinkedIn, PayScale, and McKinsey Global Institute to identify a list of the most in-demand business degrees. The top business degree they found for 2020 and beyond was a degree in Business Administration. Additionally, according to [Research.com](#), the business administration career outlook is projected to grow faster than all other occupations as shared in the Bureau of Labor Statistics report in 2021. Salaries are also substantial with a bachelor's degree salary ranging from \$60k to \$125k depending on the degree level, the industry, and the position in the company. Students graduating with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree will gain a strong business & Biblical foundation for future career opportunities.
