Throughout this program of study students will engage in significant field ministry experiences and will partner with local churches through course-required internships.

#### **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

Students who plan to enter vocational ministry have many options upon completion of the Worship Ministry specialization, as many churches contact us in search of candidates to fill a variety of roles linked to worship ministry, including worship pastor, music director, media pastor, creative arts pastor, and sound engineer.
