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OVERVIEW

Do you have multiple interests and have a hard time deciding to pursue just one area of study? This degree will introduce you to a variety of courses to help channel your thinking toward a decision for a focused major or prepare you with a breadth of classes across two or more subject areas. Most students change their major from what they may they thought they wanted before college, so declaring this major may save you hours if transferring. Being in this program for a time, may also be advantageous to take courses in multiple disciplines until you are clear on what you want to do.

The Interdisciplinary Studies Degree acclimates you to university level requirements and gives you time to decide what line of employment you may want to enter. It may also prepare you to enter most graduate programs and positions.

This degree is most useful when students have multiple interests for which there is not a prescribed degree plan. This degree provides a breadth of electives so a student may pursue two Associate Degrees while also obtaining a Bachelor's. Examples include: Business Sports Management and Health Sciences to pursue a career as a sports trainer or in the case of becoming an executive pastor, studying Bible and Theology and Business Administration.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The Interdisciplinary Studies major tells hiring leaders that this you have persisted to obtain Bachelor's Degree in lieu of just an associate degree. This lends credibility to you as an applicant. Students with this degree have become Youth Pastors, Senior Pastors, recipients of Education Teacher Certification for public, charter, private, and home school settings as well as Charter School Principals and Assistant Principals. As another example graduates have been accepted into Arts Institutes and become Graphic Designers.

While you are pursuing this degree, your advisors will help you narrow your interests and ensure you get the depth you need in addition to the breadth you desire.
