- help students discover the power of their own voices in writing and thinking;
- instill pride in the work students produce as they strive for excellence.

All of the above flow out of a deep respect for God's word and the intent to prepare students to have a ready response for skeptics – an articulate defense of the faith in our contemporary, postmodern world.

### **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

The English B.A. prepares students for a variety of professions: Education, publishing, journalism, and the arts are likely career opportunities, but English majors are sought after in all arenas. Graduates are able to demonstrate skills in communication, writing, researching, critical thinking, and empathy.
