OVERVIEW

Worship Arts is a ministry preparation program for the development of worship ministers who serve the musical needs of the Church, while serving as part of a pastoral team. In addition to the Bible core, the curriculum places an emphasis on both leadership and creative arts courses and includes hands-on internship required credit hours.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Because the Worship Arts degree with the Creative Arts specialization is designed to prepare students for vocational ministry, most of our graduates go on to become worship pastors, music directors, or creative arts pastors. This degree program places a significant emphasis on the development of skills in the creative and dramatic arts, which also enables students to pursue the fields of music performance and the dramatics arts.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The Worship Arts degree provides valuable training and preparation for students who want to pursue worship ministry. This program promotes a well-rounded approach to music ministry because of the dual focus on courses that both develop creative arts skills and cultivate leadership abilities. Worship Arts students have four internship courses built into the degree, which allow them to partner with local church worship departments.

Highlights of this degree include specialized courses, such as: Scriptwriting for Theatre, Creative Writing, and Worship Leadership.
